breast cancer in gaza: the facts

Gaza has experienced 3 major wars in 5 years, 60% of the population are unemployed, 80% are on food aid and for the last 10 years, there have been major restrictions on goods coming into Gaza and a near blanket-ban on people leaving.

During this period, cancer rates have risen dramatically in Gaza, which is particularly worrying for women, as breast cancer kills more women than any other form of cancer in Gaza and five-year survival rates for breast cancer patients are less than half of those in the UK.

Some of the reasons for this centre around a lack of education and awareness of breast cancer which reinforces women's fear over treatment (not least the examination by a male doctor), and the social stigma they fear will be attached to them. This leads many women to present themselves very late for treatment, with 60% of cases getting detected in the third stage of the disease.

There are then other issues to deal with after treatment is started. Due to the on going Israeli restriction of supplies entering Gaza and the high costs of chemotherapy drugs, patients are usually only given a four week's supply.

This means their course of treatment is only partial at best, being either interrupted or ended completely when drugs cannot be supplied. and it is common for chemotherapy course to be interrupted or ended when drugs cannot be supplied.

Radiotherapy is completely unavailable as the radioisotopes used are forbidden entry into Gaza despite having no potentially dangerous application.

Patients requiring radiotherapy must therefore apply to Israel for a permit to travel to hospitals in East Jerusalem and over 28% of those applying for permits to travel out for treatment, were either denied or received no response to their applications (World Health Organisation).

As radiotherapy is crucial in allowing breast conservation, this leads to the vast majority of women having full mastectomies and clearance of their axillary nodes.

The consequence of this is that many women are dying or are living with the scars and debilitating impact of medical techniques that are no longer practiced in the UK and there is no excuse why women in Gaza should have to suffer in this way.

What is Amos Trust doing?

Amos Trust believes that the most effective way that we can support these women is by:

- calling for an end to the blockade of Gaza so that these women can receive the treatment that is their right
- promoting community education and awareness raising so that women can have early and effective screening.

we need to make screening normal for women and change traditional attitudes. at the moment too many die, they are scared that if diagnosed they will be shunned by their families.

Amos' partner Al Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza City works with those who have been through the process to train local communities in breast cancer awareness and to create local female and male support groups (over 50 of these groups now exist).

These groups then encourage women to go to the hospital for training in self-examination. This takes place at the hospital as restrictions on fuel and electricity (power cuts are often for up to 18 hours a day), make it very difficult to run effective confidential community training sessions.

The hospital also believes that by locating this in the oncology unit, it enables women to feel more confident about accessing mammograms as part of the screening process.

So that women can remain covered they will typically use prosthetic breasts where one side has a healthy breast – the other has lumps. The women will put on the prosthetic breasts over their hijabs and practice what it feels like to find a lump. Of those who then report a concern 25% require further tests and 8% have surgery.

legal stuff

Whatever your Women 4 Women event looks like, please remember that you are personally responsible for ensuring your event is run safely.

You are responsible for organising any necessary public event licences and insurance for your event, as well as ensuring that you meet the health and safety requirements of your venue.

donations

It always works better to help people to make donations or sign up for regular giving while they are at an event rather than relying on people to remember to do it afterwards.

If possible, we would recommend setting up a laptop or tablet if you have access to the internet at your venue. Donors can then **give directy to the Women 4 Women appeal** via the Charities Aid Foundation website, make donations with credit or debit cards or sign up to become a regular giver by going to **amostrust.org/give**. Alternatively, people can give at your event without using the internet in the following ways:

regular giving

Set up a standing order by completing the form at the end of this pack, including the Gift Aid declaration if applicable. Please print a few copies of the form to have at your event.

one-off donations

Ask donors to put their cash and/or cheques into the donation envelopes provided. Please ask them to complete all the details on the envelope (including the Gift Aid declaration if applicable). Cheques should be made payable to Amos Trust with **Women 4 Women** written on the back.

The above will enable us to claim Gift Aid on applicable donations.
