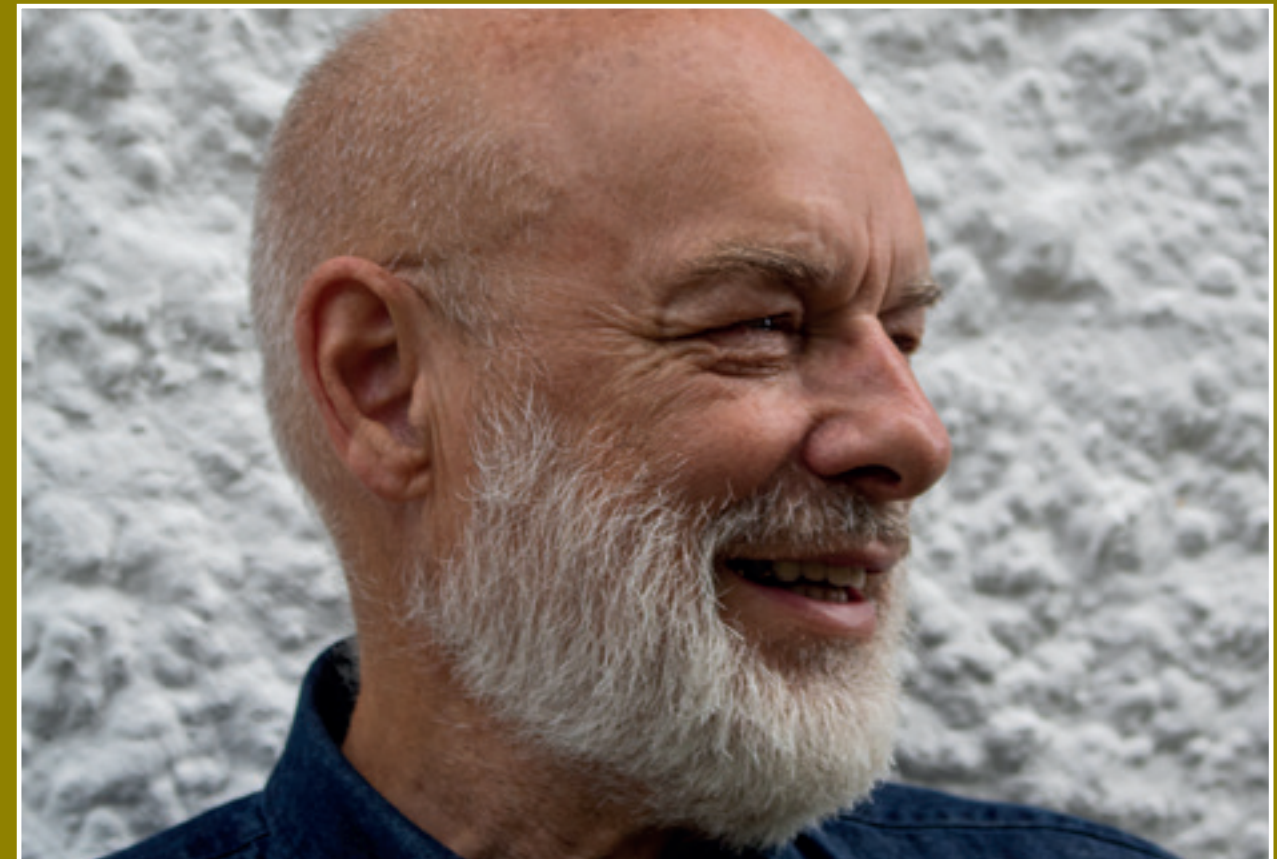

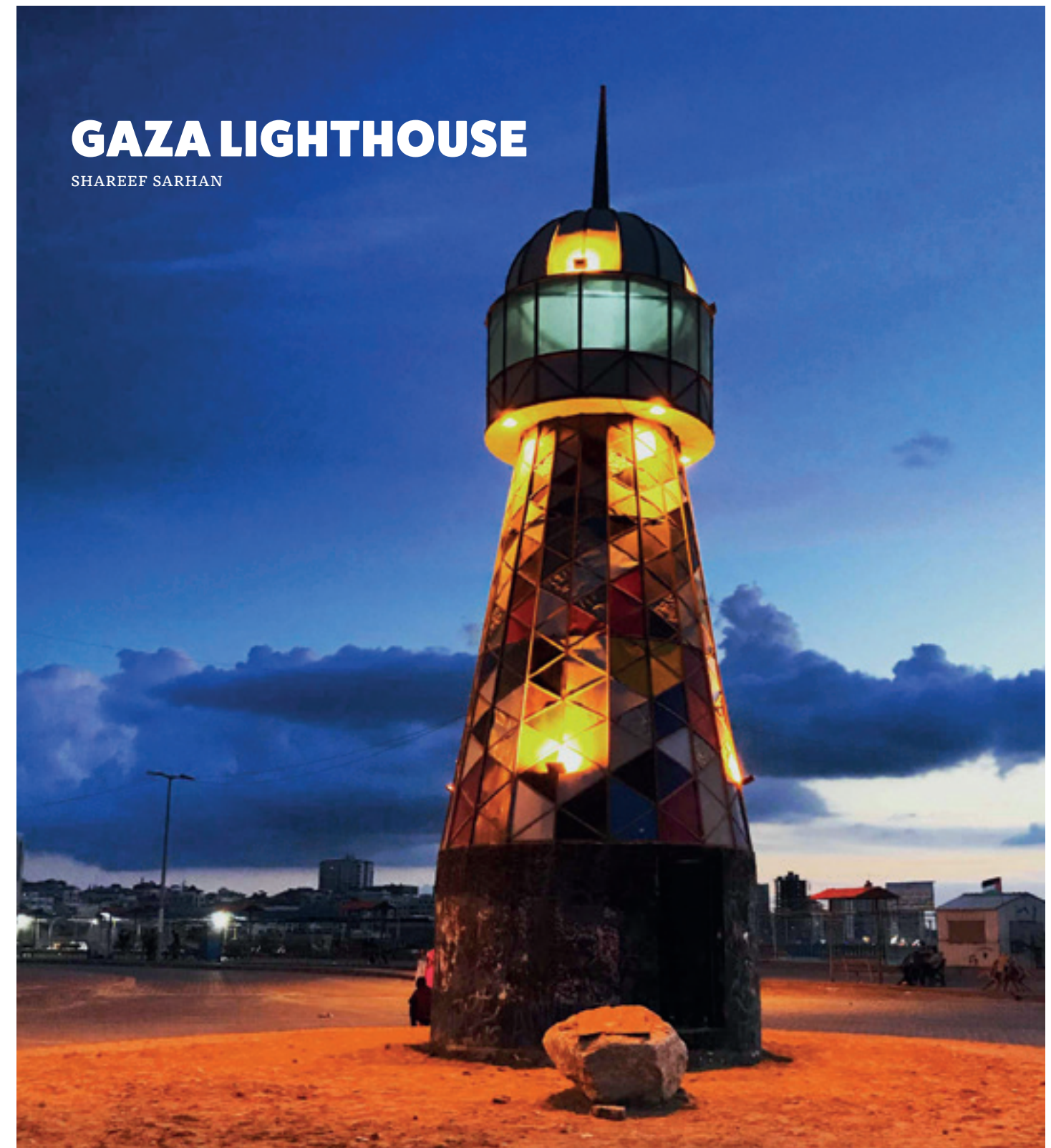
40 YEARS of celebration and lament —

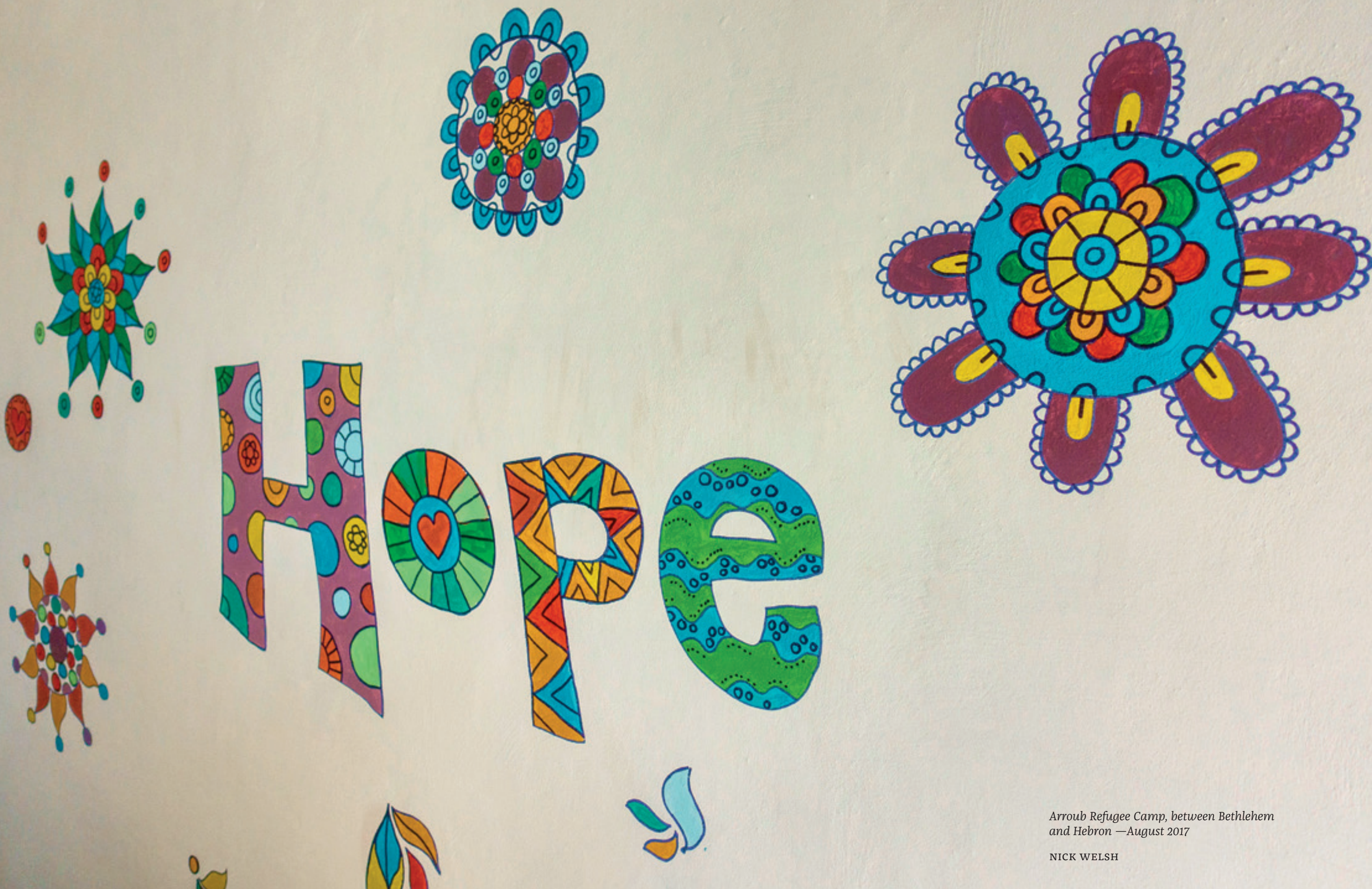


Inspired by our partners in Nicaragua (left), our Climate Fellowship supports young women land defenders and climate activists across Mexico and Central America (right).

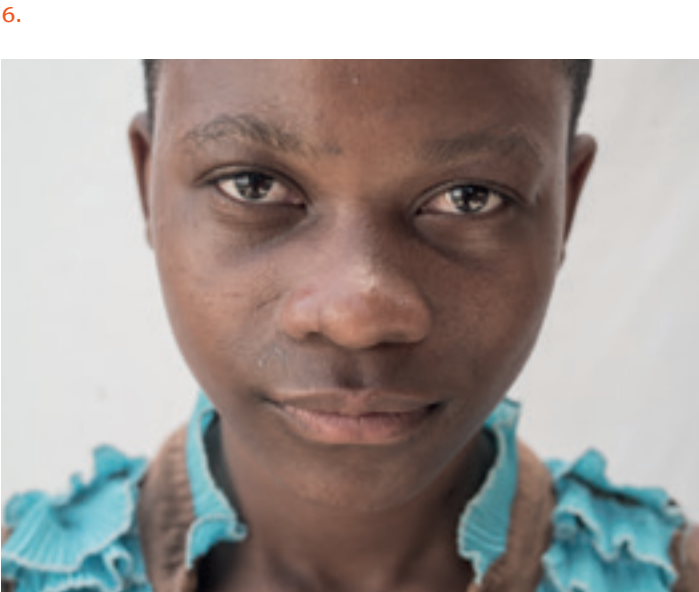
